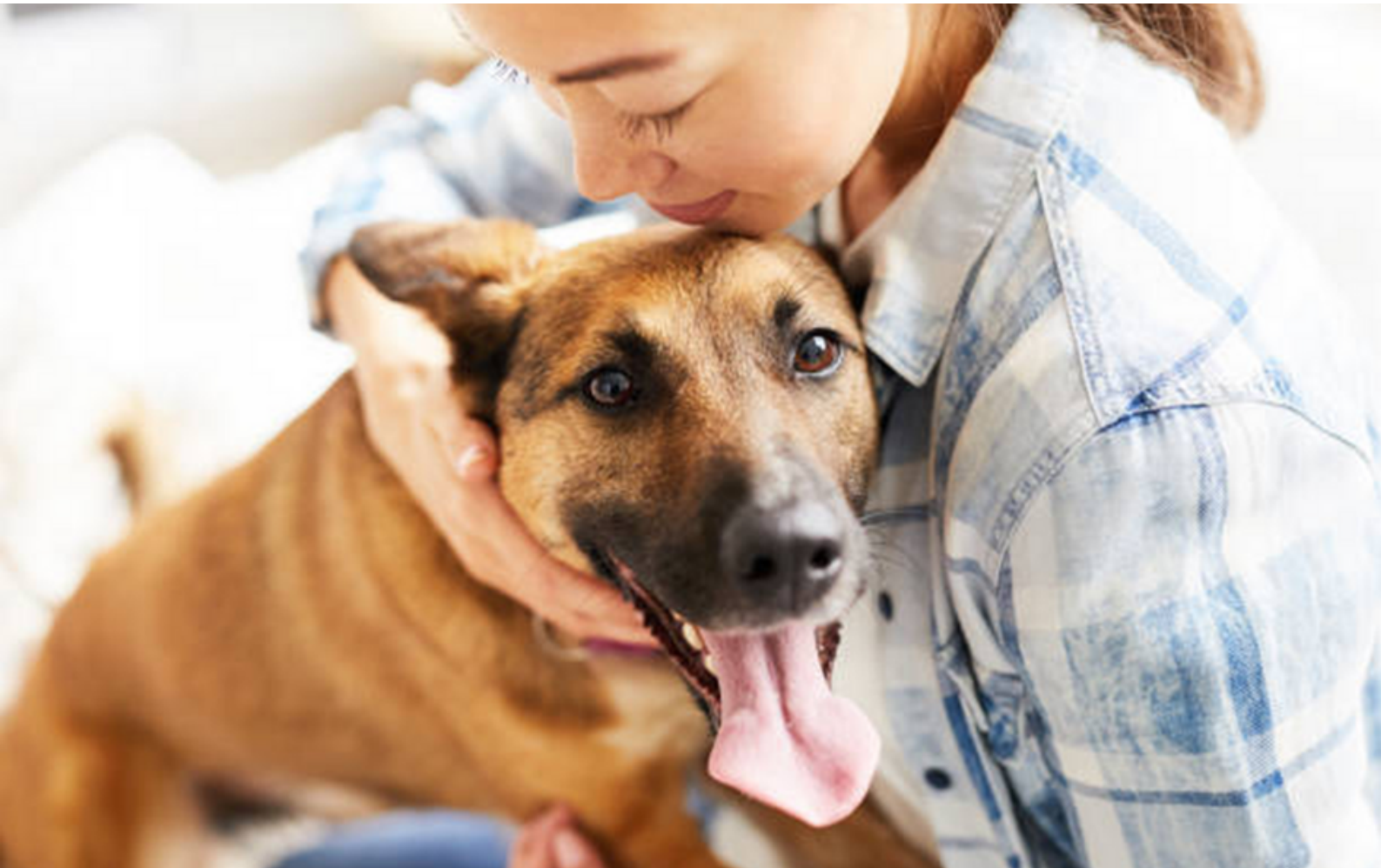




Developing an Animal Safekeeping Program: A Resource Guide
